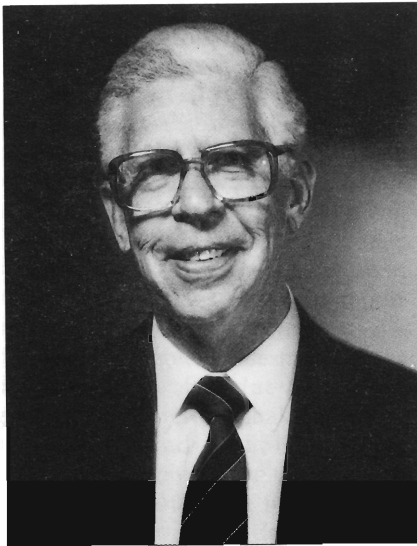


Three new Judges of Appeal



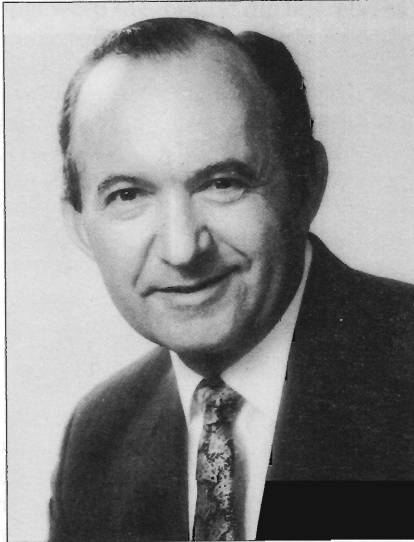
A former member of the Cape Bar, **Judge Gerald Friedman**, has been appointed to the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court of South Africa.

Mr Justice Friedman joined the Cape Bar in January 1950 after obtaining his BA LLB degrees at the University of Cape Town. He was awarded silk in 1970.

He was appointed to the Cape Provincial Division of the Supreme Court in August 1977 and to the Appellate Division on 1 October 1990.

Mr Justice Friedman served as a member of the Cape Bar Council from 1966; and was elected Chairman of the Council in 1975 and Vice-Chairman of the General Council of the Bar of South Africa (GCB) in 1976. He attended the biennial conference of the International Bar Association (IBA) in Stockholm in August 1976 and served as the GCB's representative on the Council of the IBA from 1976 to 1977, attending Council meetings in that capacity in Stockholm in 1976 and London in April 1977.

He is one of the founders of Woodside Sanctuary (Western Cape) – a welfare organisation serving the interests of seriously brain damaged children; from 1974 to 1988 he was Chairman of the Management Committee and in 1988 he was appointed Honorary Life President. He is also Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Feline Research Trust and trustee of the Leukemia Foundation of South Africa.



A former member of the Johannesburg Bar, **Judge Richard J Goldstone**, has been appointed to the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court of South Africa.

Mr Justice Goldstone joined the Johannesburg Bar in 1963 after obtaining the BA LLB degrees (cum laude) at the University of the Witwatersrand. He was awarded silk in 1976.

He was appointed to the Transvaal Provincial Division of the Supreme Court in 1980 and to the Appellate Division on 1 October 1990.

Mr Justice Goldstone is the Vice-Chairman of the World ORT Union, former Chairman of ORT South Africa, and presently its Honorary Life President. He is also National President of Nicro and its former National Chairman; Governor of the Hebrew University and former Chairman of the South African Friends of the Hebrew University; member of the Council of the University of the Witwatersrand, and Fellow of the Center for International Affairs, Harvard University.



'n Voormalige lid van die Pretoriase Balie, **Regter PM Nienaber**, is as appèlregter in die Appèlafdeling van die Hooggeregshof van Suid-Afrika aangestel.

Regter Nienaber, seun van die bekende prof GS Nienaber het in 1967 as advokaat aan die Pretoriase Balie begin praktiseer nadat hy die grade BA LLB (cum laude) aan die Universiteit van Stellenbosch en 'n PhD-graad aan die Universiteit van Cambridge met 'n Strakosch-beurs verwerf het. In 1980 is hy as senior advokaat aangestel en in dieselfde jaar het hy voorsitter van die Pretoriase Balieraad geword.

Hy is in 1982 as regter van die Natalse Provinsiale Afdeling van die Hooggeregshof aangestel en op 1 Oktober 1990 as Appèlregter.

Regter Nienaber was 'n dosent aan die Universiteit Oranje-Vrystaat asook by die Universiteit van Pretoria. Hy was ook hoof van die Departement Privaatreg by die Universiteit van Suid-Afrika.

Hy het op Universiteit te Stellenbosch by geleentheid vir sowel die eerste rugby- en krieketspan gespeel. Hy was ook onder-voorsitter van die Studenteraad.
